



OFFICER JERMAINE GALLOWAY BIOGRAPHY- “THE TALL COP”

Officer Jermaine Galloway is a nationally and internationally recognized presenter, national award winner and author of several articles. Officer Galloway has been an Idaho law enforcement officer since 1997 and has more than 14 years experience in alcohol and drug education, enforcement and prevention. Officer Galloway has dedicated hundreds of hours to community scans, research and substance abuse identification in communities across the country.

Officer Galloway currently provides nationwide training to coalition members, law enforcement, educators, youth, counselors, probation, treatment, health professionals, judges and community members. Over

the last three years, Officer Galloway has trained more than 65,000 people nationwide. Once in a specific community, Galloway trains on several different alcohol and drug topics, including: drug trends, alcohol and energy drinks, underage drinking, synthetic drugs, marijuana concentrates / dabbing, popular culture music, EDM events, inhalants, substance abuse, party patrols, fake ID's, e-cigarettes and vaporizers, party drugs, over-the-counter drugs, cough medicines, herbal drugs, designer drugs, physical signs and symptoms, popular culture phone apps, the influence of drug legalization, marijuana edibles, stash compartments, drug concealment methods, alcohol and drug clothing, logos, and identifiers.

In 2007, Officer Galloway created the Northwest Alcohol & Substance Abuse Conference. This is now a nationally recognized conference has quickly grown with attendees representing 35 different states and 2 countries.

In 2009, Officer Galloway received the national underage drinking law enforcement officer of the year award from the OJJDP (Officer of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention) for his efforts and strategies in underage drinking education and enforcement. In 2010, Officer Galloway received the national “Mickey Sadoff” underage drinking prevention award from MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) for his efforts in education and enforcement.

In 2015, Officer Galloway received an international award from AAMVA (American Association of Motor Vehicle Administrators) for his efforts in Fake ID identification, education and enforcement.

Officer Galloway is an Idaho POST certified instructor and holds a BA from the University of San Francisco.
