



Proncey Robertson

Proncey Robertson was born and raised in Blount County Alabama. He joined the US Air Force and served 4 years on Active Duty before ending his military service and received an Honorable Discharge as a veteran of the Persian Gulf War in 1990. Proncey then began working as a youth minister and a local law enforcement officer in Russellville, Arkansas. In 1994, he found opportunity and moved back to his home state of Alabama where he served at the Decatur Police Department and worked for more than 24 years before retirement in 2018.

During his many years in Decatur Proncey was one of the most decorated officers within the Decatur Police Department, with sixteen department medals, including the department's highest award, "The Medal of Valor".

Proncey has an extensive record of Law Enforcement training and experience, which he has applied to teach others at law enforcement officers at the State Police Academies. While working at Decatur PD Proncey served and supervised the Decatur Police Department's Robbery & Homicide Unit, Crime Scene Investigations (CSI), the Street Crimes Unit (ACU) and the Honor Guard Unit. He's was also a member and team commander of the Decatur Police Department's Special Response Unit (SWAT) for more than 22 years. In 2007 Proncey was appointed to and served on the FBI's Joint Terrorism Task Force for 7 years working Counter Terrorism. Proncey also spent the last decade of his law enforcement career on the Alabama Department of Education's Safe Schools Task Force working directly with local school systems to help develop their emergency response plans. During this same time he supervised the School Resource Officer Program for Decatur City Schools.

After his retirement from Law Enforcement, and having spent more than 30 years in public service, Proncey wanted to find a place to continue to sever our communities. On November 6th 2018 Proncey Robertson ran for and was elected to the State House of Representative District 7 and currently continues to serve us in this role at the Alabama State House.

Proncey is also a member of the team at nSide "The School Safety Platform". At nSide Proncey and their team of emergency planning experts continue to work with K12, School Districts, 2- and 4-year College security, as well as private sector industry and agencies to improve their safety and emergency operations plans. They are currently working with schools all across Alabama, & Mississippi and continue to expand the nSide School Safety Platform daily into other areas of the Country.

On a personal note, Proncey is married to his wife of 17 years, Kristi. They have two adult sons, Jacob and Daniel and two Granddaughters, Olivia and Blakley Mae. Proncey and Kristi are members of the Mt. Hope Baptist Church where they have taught Sunday school to adults and assisted with young ministers for many years.
